

Army Working Capital Fund (AWCF) Basic Course • 4 DAYS FMF4619

Provides the foundation for resource managers, comptrollers, and logisticians working in the 35 AWCF. Course focus is on the concepts and operating principles of the Industrial Operations and Supply Management activity groups, describing logistical and financial management activities within each business areas. Students are introduced to the concepts of revolving funds, workload identification, rates and prices, operating results, cash management, carryover, budget development, manpower, capital investment, execution activities, and key metrics.

FMF8189 **Army Working Capital Fund Overview Course • 1 DAY**

Provides an AWCF overview, an introduction to the Industrial Operations and Supply Management 14 activity groups, the basics of workload identification, and rate development.

Army Working Capital Fund Introduction Course • 4 HOURS FMF7257

Students are provided an AWCF overview, an introduction to the Industrial Operations and Supply 4 Management activity groups and a discussion of workloading.
