

Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) MEC Survey Methodology

CALIBRE developed the BOEM MEC risk evaluation framework for offshore wind energy development. CALIBRE's application of the framework to existing underwater infrastructure for a commercial client included review of historical archive information to check the potential presence of MEC, an evaluation of the potential impacts to specific operations, and a determination of relative risks of MEC to operations.

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Compliance
